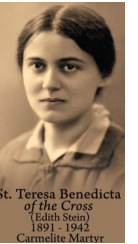

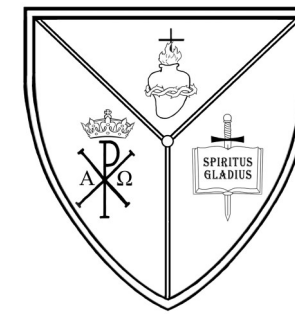

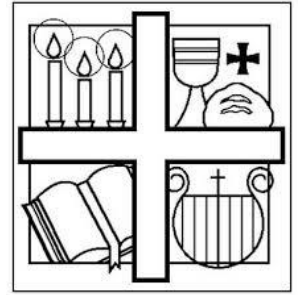

## Beyond the Veil...



This week, we enter a particularly intense time in Lent when we begin to meditate on the historical realities of Jesus' final days. Our practices, penances, devotions, and prayers should all be heightened as we enter this week and Holy Week. Liturgically, the tone of the Mass and decoration of the sanctuary take on a more somber character. The job of art and architecture in the church is not merely to serve the earthly congregation as a meeting place, but to remind us of the whole community with us in prayer: the saints, angels, souls in purgatory, and the Triune God. Our buildings and art must convey the reality that our celebrations are not merely about "us" here and now. We are gathered in the celebration of the Mass with God, with our family members and friends who have died, with countless angels and saints. We are all joined, in life and in death, by our Lord. Every time we are at Mass, we have the whole of heaven surrounding us, praying for and with us.

It has been the custom of the Roman Church, from the 17<sup>th</sup> century forward, to veil the crosses and the images of the saints from the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent until Easter. We may be surprised that the images of the Cross and statues are covered in these days. However, the Cross in Lent is not seen as an emblem of victory (as on the Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross, Sept. 14), but is seen as an instrument of humiliation and suffering. The reality is our Lord and Savior suffered a humiliating and terrible death for us.

This custom finds some origin in the Gospel of John. The Gospel of John 11:54 says that "Jesus therefore no longer walked about openly among the Jews". This is because they planned to put Him to death after He had raised Lazarus from the dead. The symbols of Jesus, therefore, were veiled in churches because He hid Himself at this time; also, this custom reminds us that His divinity was hidden during His suffering and death. The statues are also veiled because we all mourn our sins and clothe ourselves in the garments of penance. Thus, the church takes on a "fasting" appearance from the usual glory of images during this time. Fasting in this way makes Easter all the more glorious when the whole Church erupts in joy and clothes herself in the bright Spring garments (flowers, candles, bright cloths) of Our Lord's Resurrection!

Fr. Edward McNamara, professor of liturgy at the Regina Apostolorum Pontifical University in Rome, says this about the history of the custom:

"It probably derives from a custom, noted in Germany from the ninth century, of extending a large cloth before the altar from the beginning of Lent. This cloth, called the '*Hungertuch*' (hunger cloth), hid the altar entirely from the faithful during Lent and was not removed until during the reading of the Passion on Holy Wednesday at the words 'the veil of the temple was rent in two.'

The rule of limiting this veiling to Passiontide came later and does not appear until the publication of the Bishops' Ceremonial of the 17<sup>th</sup> century."

The liturgical and sacramental practices are always in addition to our works of mercy for the poor, the sick and the marginalized. There is never an either/or when it comes to the liturgical and social life of the Church. The two work hand-in-hand. A beautiful structure and a beautiful liturgy raise us up from this world, reminding all of us – poor and weak, wealthy and strong – that God is our ultimate aim in life. Having a foretaste of heaven in the liturgy should lead us to serve God and others more

faithfully. Thus, our actions, art, and liturgy should lead us into a deeper appreciation of the mystery of God.
